Minutes of May 24, 2012 Meeting


The Redistricting Sub-Committee met on Thursday, May 24, 2012, at 9:00 a.m. at the NSAA Office. Dr. Dallas Watkins chaired the meeting. The purpose of the sub-committee was to review the minutes of the December 20, 2011, Redistricting, Governance and Representation Committee and to determine a proposal for redistricting.

Sub-Committee members present were Alan Garey, Medicine Valley; Dr. Brian Maher, Kearney; Gregg Holliday, Hastings; Joan Reznicek, Ponca; Karen Hand, Lincoln Public Schools; Keith Muller, Wilber-Clatonia; and Michelle Egr, Schuyler. Ex-officio members present were Dr. Steve Shanahan and Debra Velder.

Chairman Dallas Watkins reviewed with the committee the recommendations established at the December 20th committee meeting. Sub-committee members shared proposals as well as feedback they have received on the recommendations previously discussed.

It was moved by Brian Maher, seconded by Joan Reznicek, to move forward with the following proposals to be presented at the 2012 November District Meetings:

1. Establish a map distinguishing the six NSAA legislative districts relevant to county lines.



- 2. Proposed change in Constitutional Bylaw 1.4.1 as follows: For the purpose of effecting equitable representation in the government of the Association, the state shall be divided into six basic districts. The boundaries of these districts shall be same as existed January 1, 1978 reviewed annually by the Board of Directors.
- 3. Proposed addition of Approved Ruling 1.4.1 as follows: **NSAA district boundaries will be** reviewed every four (4) years by a formal review committee comprised of eight (8) member schools and two members of the Board of Directors.

Motion passed unanimously.

The proposals if successfully passed by the NSAA member schools through the legislative process beginning in November 2012 will be scheduled for implementation in the 2013-14 school year.

With no further business, the committee stood adjourned at 10:08 a.m.
