Tom Beck, Creighton Preparatory (Boys Swimming & Diving)

Tom Beck is the Head Boys Swimming and Diving Coach at Creighton Preparatory School.

Dave Brabec, Bishop Neumann (Softball)



Dave Brabec, Head Softball Coach at Bishop Neumann, has been leading the program for 16 seasons. Under his leadership, Bishop Neumann has won three state championships (2024, 2021, and 2017) and finished as state runner-up three times. His teams have earned 8 district championships and qualified for the state tournament in 10 of his 16 seasons, amassing an impressive 381-143 coaching record. A graduate of Bishop Neumann (Class of 2004), he also spent 15 years teaching at the grade school before focusing on farming and ranching. He and his wife Katie have three sons and are expecting another child in August 2025.

Kaitlyn Clark, Gothenburg (Speech)



Steve Conner is the head Boys Bowling coach at Seward High School.




Josh Dean, Hemingford (Football)

A former club and college assistant coach, he has been recognized as Nebraska's Girls Soccer Coach of the Year multiple times and has played a pivotal role in growing the sport in the Gretna community.



Kari Meister, Gretna (Girls Swimming & Diving)

Kari Meister is in her sixth year as the Head Swim Coach for Gretna Public Schools and has played a key role in developing the district's swimming program. She previously coached at Columbus High and has been instrumental in increasing participation and achieving competitive success. Since the opening of Gretna's own pool, her team has continued to set new school records and send athletes to the state competition.

Torri Merten, Millard North (Girls Bowling)



Torri R. Merten, a teacher and registered nurse at Millard Public Schools, has combined her background in health sciences with her passion for bowling. She coaches both Unified and Varsity Bowling while also teaching in the Health Science Academy. She was named Millard Public Schools Employee of the Month in January 2025 and is a United States Bowling Congress Silver Level Coach.
