NSAA District III Meeting Minutes

Tuesday, November 12th, 2024 - Noon Northeast Community College, Lifelong Learning Center, Norfolk, NE

The NSAA District III meeting was called to order by District Three Chairman Jeff Bellar at 12:00 p.m. Mr. Bellar introduced the district managing committee and reviewed the agenda.

Roll call was held with 53 member schools present and 2 absent. The voting representative for each school physically present at the meeting was given a clicker with the number assigned to each school.

Mel Waley provided public comment on sanctioning Lacrosse at the NSAA Level. Ms. Waley remarked on the positive aspects of Lacrosse, as well as the availability of coaches and officials within the state of Nebraska. Ms. Waley also commented on the efforts made to promote it as an emerging sport, and asked that District III consider voting on it as an emerging sport. Mr. Bellar thanked her for her time and her comments.

No comments were made in NSAA Member comment.

A motion was made by Battle Creek, second by Winside to approve the minutes of the January 2024 meeting. Motion carried by voice vote.

A motion was made by Cedar Catholic, second by Hartington Ponca, to approve the Financial Report. Motion carried by voice vote.

Dr. Jon Cerny, NSAA Board of Director Member from District III, gave his Director's Report. Dr. Cerny thanked the District III representatives for the opportunity to represent them on the board of directors. Dr. Cerny congratulated schools that were successful this fall at the NSAA championship contests, and wished all the teams still in the playoffs good luck. He made comments on the positive feedback on the Administrator Badges, and thanked the NSAA staff on how well that has been received. He made comments on the fact that the NSAA is working hard to give back to their member schools that host NSAA events, and in conjunction with eliminating the 50-mile radius to schools on state reimbursement checks, added 125000.00 back to district host schools and another 75000.00 back to schools on state championship reimbursements. Dr. Cerny then talked about eh importance of filling out the NSAA's climate survey, as well as the work being done by the competitive balance committee. He talked about the NSAA's partnership with Kordica Marketing and Communications to assist the NSAA with its corporate partnerships, communication, and strategic planning process. He then discussed the NSAA Due process and hardship criteria proposals presented to the district.

NSAA Staff member Jon Dolliver asked if anyone does not yet have shot clocks installed to communicate with him, and he gave an update on the district medal sizes, and that they will be bigger and will start being handed out (the larger ones) in the 2025-26 year.

Jason Polk-Wisner Pilger, gave the class caucus committee report.

Kayla Fischer, representative from the Athletic directors' association, gave her report.

Kayla Fischer representative from the Nebraska Coaches Association, gave her report.

The NSAA Student Advisory Council gave a presentation, outlining what they are currently doing, and their volunteer efforts to give back to the community.

Motion by Hartington-Newcastle, second by Stanton, to consider all proposals submitted by the NSAA. Motion carried by voice vote.
