About

The NSAA Student Advisory Committee is a diverse group of students who participate in NSAA sanctioned activities and are focused on providing education and leadership through open and honest communication with all member schools and their students, administrators, and coaches. This committee serves as the liaison between students, administrators, the NSAA Staff and Board of Directors.

Vision

Committee Terms

The NSAA Student Advisory Committee consists of 20 students (10 Seniors and 10 Juniors) representing all six NSAA Districts. Students serve two-year terms and meet 4 times annually excluding the NFHS National Student Leadership Summit.

Application Process

Students who are current Sophomores can apply to join the NSAA Student Advisory Committee. Students are required to fill out the application found on the NSAA website or their school's AD Login page. The application includes academic information, letters of recommendation and an essay.

Selection Process

Students are selected from the six NSAA Districts. The selection process would have a focus on the representation of classification, school, gender and minority representation.

Duties and Responsibilities

The Student Advisory Committee will create their strategic direction for the school year with emphasis on tackling current student issues, helping maintain an avenue of communication between the Association and the student participants themselves and assisting with various Association functions. The avenues used to accomplish these goals are:

- Provide student perspective on bylaw changes.
- Develop and deliver a presentation at the annual NCA Sportsmanship/Leadership Summits.
- Record Sportsmanship PSA's to be shown at State Championships and via social media.
